NAEB will hold its usual meeting in connection with the Twelfth Institute for Education by Radio which will be held May 4-7. The Institute is sponsored by Ohio State University.

## ACTIVITIES AT WOSU

The Ohio School of the Air has all programs originated at WOSU and two of them have been fed coast-to-coast over the Mutual network from September 30 to March 1.

Nearly 600 school systems in the State of Ohio are utilizing programs from the Ohio School of the Air.

WOSU has applied to the FCC for sunrise to sunset operation with a power of 5,000 watts.

Wm. Friel Heimlich, Program Supervisor, WOSU, is a first lieutenant in the army reserve and has been called to active duty with the G-2 staff of the Fifth Corps Area. His service starts today.

Recently Heimlich completed a twenty-week series of weekly meetings with the Zanesville Radio Workshop under the sponsorship of the Evaluation of School Broadcasts Project of the Bureau of Educational Research.

WOSU has Radio Junior College adult listeners enrolled from every county of Ohio and in West Virginia, Indiana, Michigan, and Canada, and that since the war began the Canadian enrollments have increased.

C. S. Bidlack, former chief engineer of WOSU and lately engineer for WTAM at Cleveland, has been ordered to active duty with the Armored Corps at Fort Knox in his capacity as a reserve officer.

ANDY RING RESIGNS FCC POSITION

After nearly 12 years of active Government service in radio broadcast engineering, Andrew D. Ring has resigned as Assistant Chief Engineer of the Federal Communications Commission to engage in private engineering practice. He will be associated in Washington with Ralph L. Clark, who has also resigned from the Commission engineering staff for this purpose.

FCC ACTIONS

KFJL, University of North Dakota, has been granted a temporary extension of license, pending further consideration of its application for renewal by the FCC. (3/25/41)

WNAD, University of Oklahoma, has also been granted a temporary extension of license, pending consideration of an application before FCC. (3/25/41)

WOSU, Ohio State University, has been granted temporary extension of license pending action of FCC on application. (3/25/41)

WNYE, Board of Education, City of New York, was granted construction permit to change frequency from 41100 kc to 42100 kc, increase power to 1000 watts, and change type of emission to special for frequency modulation. (3/25/41)
